# DOTCOM Waste Concept

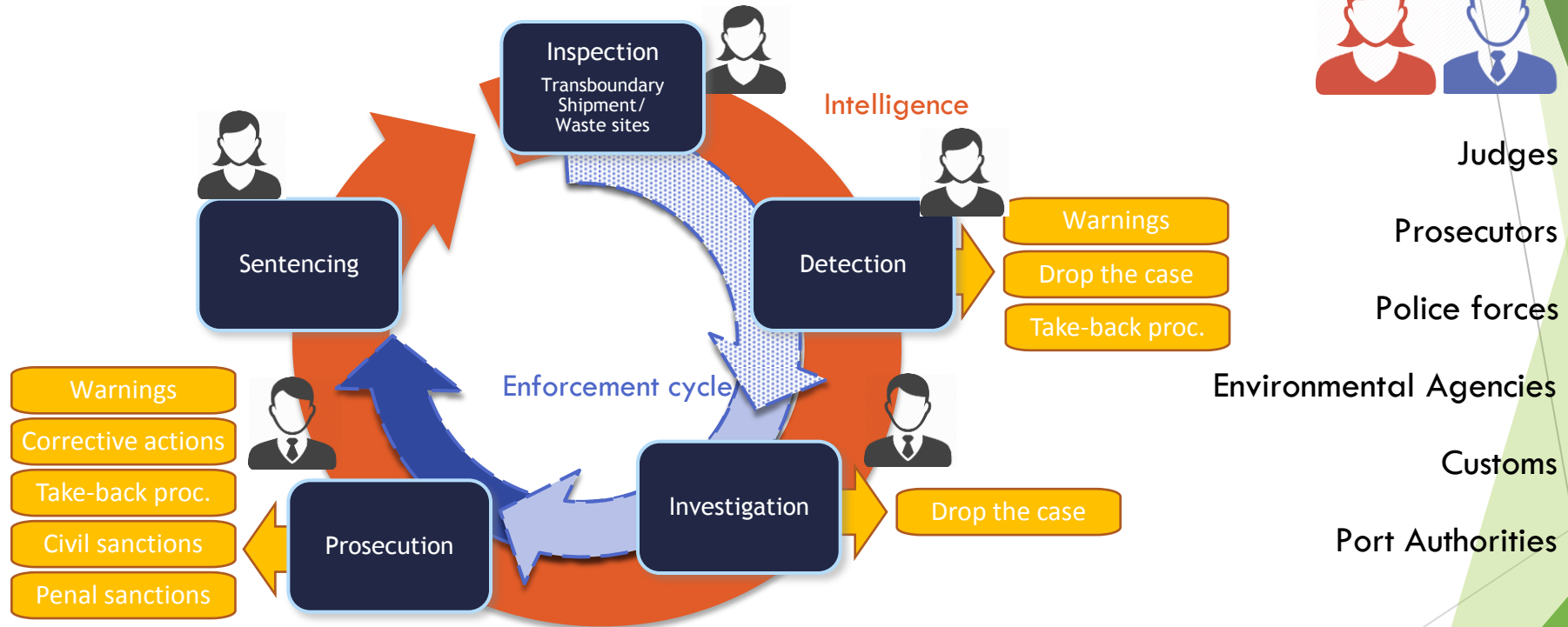


- The project is about WASTE

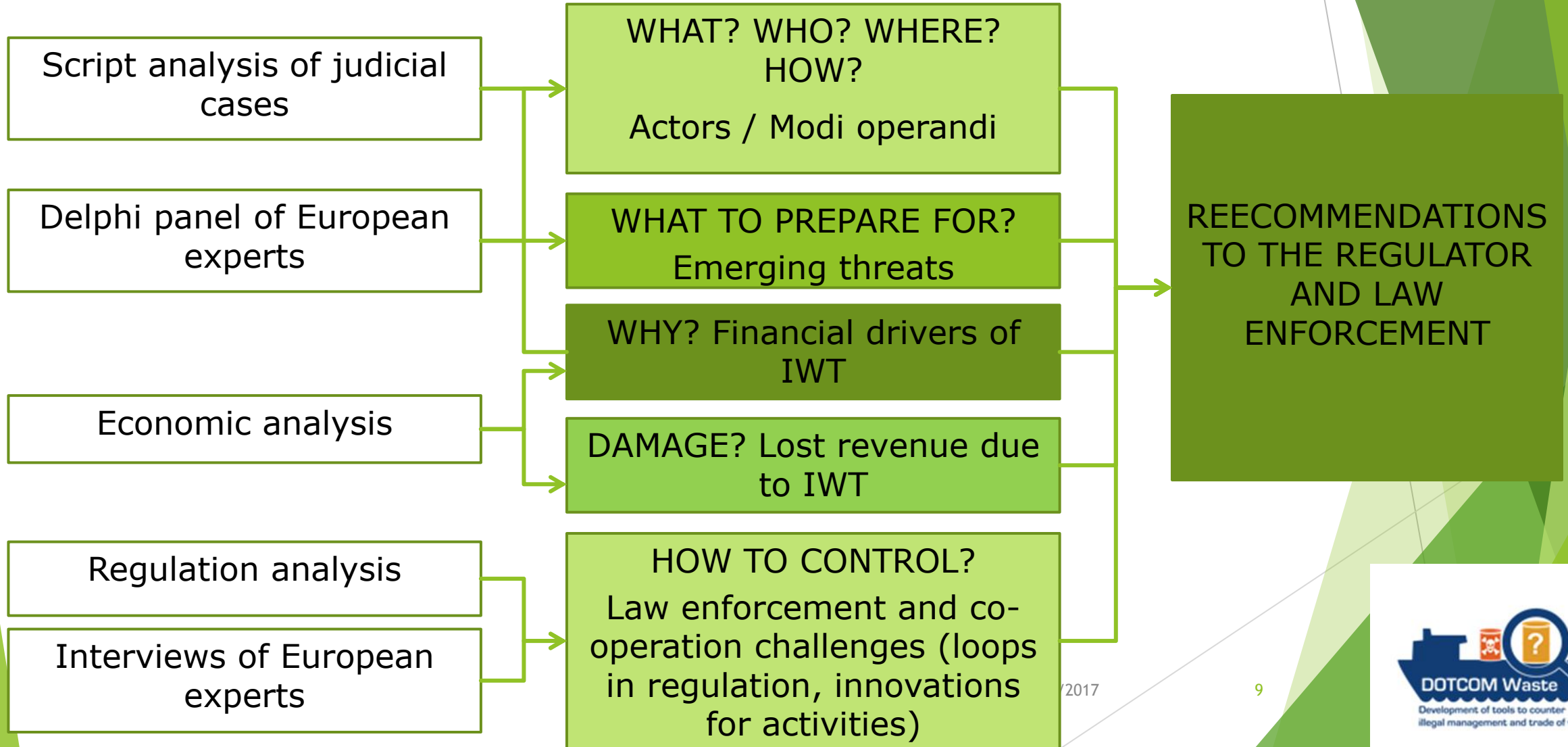
## Project objectives
